

- 3) The context: - To provide platform for the students .prepare for different examination and subjects, students are string and stout and clear physical test but lacks behind written examination. Due to socio economic disparity, students come from different backgrounds and abilities shows different performances, to minimise the difference in performance college decided to give platform to all and special police pre recruitment training by test series for college and outside students which cannot afford private coaching and test series .a subsidised fee was collected from participants which was reimbursed when they qualify the exam.
- 4) The Practice:- From the last seven years college sports department is organising camp for students, ex students ,other students from area. They have made available coach for Long jump, Shot put, Double bar, single bar etc. At the same time they are provided with written exam coaching by expert. After completion of training a test series is conducted for physical as well as written exam which was conducted between 11February 2018 to 1 April 2018.
- 5) Evidence of Success:-

Our institution has been successfully implementing this programme. Total 70 students participated in this training. Result was declared after every test which improved the efficiency of students and 04 students got selected for police training
- 6) Problems encountered and resources required:-

As the students are from the peasant families and they are poor so they are less aware about the Sports. They are interested but they do not get proper knowledge of cricket playing skill and to make carrier in sports.

In the rural areas, ground and well equipped facilities for playing cricket are not available and Financial problems are the most effective factor to develop the games and sports.

1) Title of practice – **Summer Cricket Coaching Camp 2017-2018**

2) Goal - The aim of this coach induction is to equip the coaches with the necessary skills and information to become actively involved with the students during cricket coaching sessions.

This induction largely includes practical training, inputs on student's psychology, lots of fun and an assessment process for the development of the skills which are required to supervise and instruct students.

Our area is rural so that there is lack of facilities in cricket to the students of our college and outside of college players. So we have tried to provide them maximum facility as we possible to players and to make them a skilful player.

1) **The Context:**

There is lot of challenges in rural area to conduct the sports camp in any games. The Parents thinking is sports is west of time, so they don't give permission to their wards to join any game.

Ground facilities are so poor there is no turf wicket available, out filed is not proper. Qualified coaches are not available easily.

2) **The Practice:**

Along with our regular programmes, we conduct extensive Summer Camps this year, coinciding with the school holidays. These day camps are packaged with comprehensive skill development classes and fitness sessions. Selected talents from these camps are encouraged to become our regular students as well.

Our Summer Camp programs are a comprehensive cricket camp for young cricketers offering them an opportunity to learn at the state-of-the-art campus at our college enhancing their cricketing abilities. The intensive training session includes training and drills, personal and group coaching, personality development and mental and physical fitness, along with other learning prospects. This year the event is organized from **20April 2018 to 05th May 2018.**

Daily Schedule

The camp is organized to benefit the participant by offering them maximum in terms of cricketing abilities and sportsmen qualities. And to achieve the same a well balanced daily schedule is structured for the participants. The daily schedule during the camp will be as mentioned below.

Morning Session - 06:00 AM To 09:00 AM

Evening Session - 04:00 PM To 07:00 PM

3) Evidence of Success:

In our cricket coaching camp 30 student participated. Three coaches of different skill knowledge were appointed. Participants get lot of knowledge about different skill and they improve their skill.
